Yr 9 (Summer 2023) has the highest percentage of pupil premium students, and is out most challenging year group. Years 7 and 8 have fewer PP students, but still a significant percentage (Over 44% and 46% respectively). These years groups have an increased number of complex students, which is increasing with each new cohort. These figures do not include a number of students who are not classified as disadvantaged but still face challenging circumstances. These students also need the support of the school.

The overall attendance is 91.8% (NA 90% and Havering 92%). PP attendance is 89.4% which is slightly below NA. The gap between PP and non-PP is 4.4% difference (increase on last year). The PA figures is 26.3% (NA 27.8% and Havering 21.9%). The PP PA attendance is a 36%, which is an ongoing concern. The pastoral and safeguarding teams are working hard to combat this.

Although the average disadvantaged attitude to learning score is good, there is a small gap between that and the non-disadvantaged. The only year group where the ATL was below 3 was Year 9 PP. Pastoral teams are closely monitoring and supporting students whose attitude to learning is a concern.

The percentage of on calls for disadvantaged students is 53%, which is a reduction from last year (58%). Although this is a decrease in number compared to 2020/21 it is a concern as it is significantly higher than the percentage of disadvantaged in the school. Year 9 is a particular concern.

The total percentage of TIER punishments for disadvantaged students has increased from 45% in 2021/22 to 52% in 2022/23. This is above the percentage of disadvantaged students in the school. (44%)

Year 9 behaviour is a concern (this is a national trend). The on call and tier statistics can be narrowed down to a small group of students. These students are progressing through the behaviour levels in line with the behaviour policy. Staff absence in the pastoral team has now been covered.

Small group tuition (groups of 3) now takes place weekly during a variety of lessons, not core as in previous years. The sessions have focused on KS 3 to support the newly implemented curriculum and literacy strategy. The main focus has been literacy so that the students have the skills to access the wider curriculum. The feedback from the catch-up tuition sessions has been very positive, with all students feeding back that they are now more confident in lessons. The classroom teachers have also reported that 78% of students have improved their academic attainment.

The overall A8 score for 2022/23 is 41.7 which is a 2.6 increase from the last examined cohort in 2019. The PP results show an A8 score of -0.1 when compared to the same results.

The 2018/19 cohort had an A8 gap between PP and Non-PP of 5.4. The gap for the 2022/23 cohort has grown to 8.4. However overall the P8 score has improved by nearly half a grade from -0.85, with PP being -1.04 (2022) to -0.40 (2023), with PP being -0.45.

The largest area for concern is the 24.1% gap between the disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged 5+ English and Maths, and the 31% gap in 4+ English and Maths.

Actions

Attendance initiatives focusing on PP run for 4 weeks at the end of each term. These focus on students between 88% and 92% attendance. Students are met daily by SAGM's with rewards given to those that complete the 4 weeks without missing a day. A borough behaviour intervention program is running for a group of Year 7 and 8 students as a pro-active measure to prevent a decline in their behaviour. We are focusing on core-4+, 5+ crossover, with core being prioritised for intervention. Additional staffing is in place in Maths from September, Science from November and English from January.
